Additional notes on fees

One semester consists of 12 Saturdays and students who have less than 12 Saturdays to attend after completing the compulsory Diagnostic & Alignment sessions will pay a fee which is pro-rata i.e. the semester fee divided by 12, multiplied by the number of Saturdays they have left.

The D & A (Diagnostic & Alignment) is compulsory and the first four sessions are always payable at the D & A fees, irrespective of when a student starts.

All our Science courses at GCSE and KS3 cover modules in Physics, Chemistry and Biology and are usually taught by three different teachers, each is a subject specialist. There is usually a rotation system, in which only two of the three subject areas are covered on a Saturday. For example, Physics and Biology are covered for four weeks, followed by another four weeks of Chemistry and Biology and so on. About equal amount of time would have been spent on each of the three by the end of a given semester.

English Language and English Literature are taught as a combined course and the fee is that of one subject, although the student will obtain two GCSE grades - one for Language and another for Literature.

The fees for students taking three subjects at GCSE are those for two subjects and also for one subject added together

KS3 students are usually expected to take all the three subject areas. However, if the parent prefer they do not, we do allow them to take at least two subjects - either English & Maths or Science (science counts as two subjects)

Timing for the combined GCSE includes 35 minutes of study / progress test

For Seminar / one-to-one, there are 1.5 hours of seminar, then the student does a set task for an additional hour. The task could be any time within the 2.5 hour period.
